## How It's Delivered

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| <b>Where.</b> Your venue — a room the host provides. Philadelphia region; elsewhere in the Northeast on request.                          | <b>Length.</b> Single evening to sixteen-session series, shaped to your calendar.                               |
| <b>Materials.</b> Syllabus, discussion questions, and readings supplied — all public-domain or open-access, so students never buy a book. | <b>Cost.</b> A first session is often offered without charge as a proof of concept. Ongoing terms fit the host. |
