Reading Emerson

The founding voice of American thought

A four-session close-reading of Ralph Waldo Emerson's essential essays. Emerson made American thought possible — the writer who gave American writers permission to trust the news of the self. We read four of his central essays slowly, sentence by sentence.

SIX REPRESENTATIVE SESSIONS

1. Session 1 — 'Nature' (1836): the founding manifesto
2. Session 2 — 'Self-Reliance': the essay every American has heard of
3. Session 3 — 'The American Scholar': the intellectual Declaration of Independence
4. Session 4 — 'Circles': Emerson revising Emerson
5. Sentence patterns: how Emerson builds a thought
6. Reading Emerson aloud: rhythm as argument
