The Irish Literary Imagination

From the Táin and Swift to Yeats, Joyce, Heaney, Boland

Ireland is a small country with a literature of astonishing scale. From medieval saga through the eighteenth-century satirists, the Celtic Revival, the Irish modernists, the Northern poets of the Troubles, and the writers of the contemporary Republic. Discussed in the way the Irish themselves prefer to discuss literature: slowly, with feeling, and with a strong sense that every text is somebody's argument.

3. W.B. Yeats: the poet of the movement
4. James Joyce: from Dubliners to Ulysses
